1. MESSAGE FROM THE MANAGING TRUSTEE

Serving society has become a central goal for many individuals and organizations worldwide, and India is no exception. The number of people contributing and the amount being donated continue to grow year after year. In 2024, Indian philanthropy saw significant contributions from leading industrialists and high-net-worth individuals, reflecting a deepened commitment to societal betterment.

Shiv Nadar, founder of HCL Technologies, led the list with donations totaling ₹2,153 crore, marking a 5% increase from the previous fiscal year

Mukesh Ambani and his family secured the second position, donating ₹407 crore through the Reliance Foundation, an 8% rise from the prior year.

The Bajaj family climbed three ranks to third place with a contribution of ₹352 crore, reflecting a 33% increase from the previous fiscal year.

Other notable philanthropists include Kumar Mangalam Birla and family, who donated ₹334 crore, a 17% rise from the prior year, and Gautam Adani and family, who contributed ₹330 crore, a 16% increase.

Collectively, the top ten donors contributed ₹4,625 crore, accounting for 53% of the total donations in the list of over 200 donors.

These figures underscore a growing philanthropic culture among India's affluent, with education, healthcare, and rural development being primary focus areas. The trend indicates a broader commitment to addressing societal challenges and promoting inclusive growth.

However, the true magnitude of contributions is far greater when we consider the donations made by the general public, along with the charity work being carried out by small NGOs and individuals across the country. Despite the progress, the needs of the nation remain vast, and it is imperative that every family contributes to alleviating the hardships faced by the underprivileged in remote areas.

It was with this thought in mind that the **Plus Approach Foundation (PAF)** was established in 2011. While we have made small strides, PAF continues to serve the underprivileged through various initiatives, in particular empowering the villagers, through remedial and digital classes, sewing classes, the Sapno Ka Ghar program, the Vidushi Vivah Kanyadaan Yojna, the YIC Transformation Academy, and providing artificial limbs to amputees including help to needy people.

PAF remains committed to serving needy families across these areas, relying on the generous donations and sponsorships we receive from individuals and corporates. I take this opportunity to express my heartfelt gratitude to all the members, volunteers, trustees, sponsors, and donors whose unwavering support has been instrumental in enabling PAF to reach its present level of impact.

Dear Members,

It is my privilege to present the Annual Report of Plus Approach Foundation for the financial year 2023-24. Since its inception on May 9, 2011, the foundation has been dedicated to uplifting the weaker sections of society. Our mission is to create lasting change in Almora



district by focusing on education, skill development, financial assistance for the marriage of daughters from underprivileged families, and improving housing conditions.

Over the past year (2023-24), we have positively transformed 80 lives, and in the last five years, we have impacted 798 lives. Our key initiatives include:

- **Skill Development:** Sewing training provided to 238 women, empowering them towards financial independence.
- **Digital Education:** Training imparted to 178 students, bridging the digital divide.
- Remedial Education: Support extended to 248 students, ensuring no child is left behind.
- **Financial Assistance:** Aid provided to 14 families for their daughters' marriages, making dreams come true.
- **Housing Support:** Assistance given to 24 families for house construction or repairs, ensuring safe and dignified living.
- **Communication Skills Development:** The 'Vakta' program benefited 136 children in the past five years, fostering confidence and leadership.

5. AIMS & OBJECTIVES

Prime objective of the foundation is:

- To enable every abled person, take responsibility for the economically weaker section of society, and motivate them to better their situation through action, and thereby, getting themselves to realize their full potential
- To disseminate Positive Approach among the masses and Hand holding of "Poor" students to "Transform their Lives"
- Doing research on Positive Behavior and its impact
- Founding more initiatives to create a more Positive Society and India

These objectives are broadly stated as:

- To conduct seminars on positive thinking and leadership for all ages, especially for children
- Organise vocational manpower training programs and develop skills to generate employment of youth and Women
- To help furtherance of education of the students from economically weaker families by providing scholarships, assistance by way of reimbursement of tuition fees, cost of books, uniforms etc.
- To identify students who have the potential to clear competitive examinations such as IIT-JEE, AIEE, Medical Entrance, Indian Administrative Services etc. and provide free coaching.
- To work for energy conservation like "switching off lights when not required" and by other methods like promoting off grid solar systems and standalone installations.

- To work for maintaining and spreading the cultural heritage of Uttarakhand region.

6. ABOUT THE FOUNDATION

PLUS APPROACH FOUNDATION (PAF) is a trust that believes in being positive and that it is the most important tool for self-progress and is necessary for the socio-economic development of the community it was established in the year 2011. This was an initiation towards disseminating positive thinking as a way of life. It was established to strengthen the society and create a sustainable level of living for the weaker sections of the society. Also, as a step towards fulfilling the objectives of the various projects of the Government of India and therefore, be an integral part of national development. The Foundation is registered in Delhi, under the Laws of India with charitable status pursuant to a "Deed of Trust" on 9th of May, 2011. The trust has also received the status of Income Tax exemption under section 80 G of the Income Tax Exemption Act. The Trust is also registered with MCA for undertaking CSR Projects.

The Managing Trustee, Mrs. Vidushi Karnatak is governing the trust, along side other trustees as appointed by the trust. An executive board is formed to run the projects and monitor each activity. All the activities, income and expenditures are duly audited every year by a registered accounting firm. The foundation has a wide base of volunteers across various regions, who are constantly working to promote the mission and vision of the organization.

Since establishment, members and volunteers of PAF have taken positive steps to initiate projects that enables the team to work in alignment with the mission of the PAF. All activities are planned and proposed to align with the **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)**. Officially known as **Transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development** is a set of 17 "Global Goals" Spearheaded by the **United Nations** through a deliberative process involving its 193 Member States, as well as global civil society, the goals are contained in paragraph 54 United Nations Resolution A/RES/70/1 of 25 September 2015.

Ongoing Programs & initiatives:

PIE Village – The remote village of Matila in Almora district of Uttrakhand, adopted as PIE village and initiatives for positive & sustainable transformation of villagers covering everyone from children, women, youth, adults and elderly are being undertaken by Foundation. Since its beginning in 2021 following projects have being taken up and so far foundation has touched about 800 lives to bring positive transformation in their lives.

- "Yes I Can" Transformation & Skilling Academy
 - a. Remedial Classes for children to strengthen their fundamentals
 - b. Digital awareness & Computer training
 - c. Vakta Programme for students to strengthen communication skills
 - d. **Sewing** & Tailoring skill center for women empowerment
- "Sapno Ka Ghar" for Renovation / construction of houses for poor: "Roti kapda aur makaan" was once considered to be basic necessity of life, which has now extended to education, information & digital. However, proper shelter is still the primary need of a person. In the village, many poor families are still deprived of this and living in unhygienic, dilapidated spaces. "Sapno Ka Ghar" i.e. SKG is being taken up as a flagship project by PAF to provide basic living infrastructure to many families living in unsafe dilapidated unhygienic structures in the remote villages through repair / construction of dilapidated houses
- Vidushi Vivah "Kanyadan" Plus Approach Foundation is actively working in the transformation & up-liftment of people living in the remote villages of Uttrakhand. One of the initiatives being implemented towards Women empowerment is facilitating daughters of low-income families of marriageable age to get married by bearing the expenses of the wedding.

- **Empowerment of Divyang**: The aim of Foundation is reach to the most needy & underprivileged section of the society and work for their transformation. In our maiden effort, amputees of the remote areas of Uttrakhand were facilitated with artificial limbs & support.
- Inspiration Library: In addition to the above, many other initiatives are under consideration to fulfill the vision of transformation of villages to PIE villages. In the year 2021, PAF has initiated the development of "Inspiration Library" (Prerana Pustkalya) in 10 schools and funded these libraries as per recommendation of District administration of Almora.

Activities at a glance










The major activities during 2023-24 were:

PEAK YIC Start Up Awards – Mr Ranjeet Singh, Ms Namita Tewari and Ms Kavita Parihar.


